Domaine des Malandes, Chablis

Created in 1973 by Lyne Marchive from 7ha of top vineyards sites inherited from her parents. Post-war, they had traded valuable agricultural land for less desirable (at the time!) vineyards in Chablis, including part of 1^{er} Cru Fourchaume. Since 2018 it has been

run by the next generation, brother and sister Amandine Marchive and Richard Rottiers, with Guénolé Breteaudeau as technical director since 2006 (pictured right, with Amadine).

Their Envers del Valmur vineyard sits within the Grand Crus and is a monopole of the Domaine, but was only planted by Amandine's grandfather in 1967, so remains Village level classification, despite its enviable position.

Indigenous yeast strains have been cultivated and used to ensure fermentations are consistent yet retain a sense of place. For Grand Crus, 70% are fermented and aged in barrel, 30% in stainless steel. For 1^{er} Crus and Envers del Valmur, 30% are fermented in barrel with 70% in stainless steel. The wines rest on their lees for 6-7 months after fermentation and are racked off in May, then blended with stainless portion. Barrels are from Claude Gillet in Saint Romain. Older barrels are returned to the cooper, cleaned, re-toasted and fitted with new heads. All wines are organic.

Perfect conditions throughout the summer of 2023 meant large bunches of healthy fruit arrived at the winery after picking commenced on 18th September. These wines showcase the region's hallmark racy acidity and tension, despite the lush Chardonnay fruit that has dominated in recent years. Village level wines have a refined, fresh, zippy character, whilst 1^{er} Cru and Grand Cru sites develop complexity with stone fruits and smoky mineral notes.

Domaine du Clos du Roi, Coulanges-la-Vineuse

Coulange is a small village 30 mins drive South West of Chablis. Like its neighbour Irancy, Coulange is permitted to use the Cesar grape in its red wines (up to 15% in Coulange, vs. 10% in Irancy). Historically, it was used to add colour and body to light Pinot Noir cuvees, however in recent years, Pinot is ripening up nicely, and Magali Bernard of Domaine du Clos du Roi is making beautiful examples from 100% Pinot Noir that are full of energy.

She prefers to let the grapes do the work – natural yeast fermentations, careful use of sulphur and raising in large oak foudre for up to 18 months.

In addition, there is an old vine Pinot Noir cuvee Chanvan that is aged for 18-24 months in barrels, and a unique solera Pinot Noir L'Intemporelle (*timeless*) that combines the crunchy freshness of new wine with forest floor complexity found in mature Pinot.

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Domaine d'Ardhuy, Corgoloin

The last property of the Cote de Nuits before Ladoix-Serrigny. Ardhuy's cellars are within the Clos des Langres vineyard, planted in the 10th Century by the Monks of Cluny. Gabriel d'Ardhuy was hired as oenologist to look after the vineyard, fell in love, and married into the family, creating Domaine d'Ardhuy in 1948.

Vincent Bottreau heads up the winemaking team, with help from Thomas Chekroun. They are working towards Organic re-certification in 2027. The reds are plush and approachable in youth, usually destemmed, but will depend on the vintage. Village whites are harvested a little earlier for freshness, and aged in stainless steel, oak and jars. 1^{er} Cru and Grand Cru whites are left on the vine longer to develop phenolic ripeness, aged exclusively in oak with a greater proportion of lees to develop some reductive notes. Sealed with extra long corks and wax, these are wines intended for longer ageing in bottle.

Domaine A.-F. Gros, Beaune

The marriage of Anne- Françoise Gros and François Parent created Domaine AF Gros in 1988, and since 1998 has been located in their central Beaune cellars. Siblings Caroline Parent-Gros and Mathias Parent now run the business, with Mathias taking over winemaking in 2013 after 3 years alongside his father François.

The wines have a delicate spiciness and are all extremely approachable in youth, however the 1^{er} and Grand Crus begin to reveal their complexity after some years in bottle. Village and 1^{er} Cru wines use 30-50% whole bunches. Grand Crus use 50-70% whole bunch. Mathias prefers not to filter the wines, as he finds it can affect the aromatics.

A 4ha parcel of old vine Moulin-a-Vent en Mortperay was purchased in 2016 with the help of Richard Rottiers (a family friend) which makes for a very serious, age worthy wine and complements their existing holdings.

Domaine Bader-Mimeur, Chassagne-Montrachet

The historic Chateau de Chassagne-Montrachet is home to Nathalie Bernard and the Bader-Mimeur family. Her brother Sebastien Fossier is current winemaker (both pictured, right). They are the 5th generation at Bader-Mimeur.

All wines are fermented with natural yeast. Whites in barrel and reds in large open top, wooden vats. Village and 1^{er} Cru wine see 20% new oak, medium toast, with battonage every 3 weeks and aged for 10 months.

Vines for their Bourgogne Pinot Noir, Chardonnay and Aligoté wines are located across the D906 road at the bottom of the property, just outside the Chassagne borders. These "entry-level" wines are made in the same way as Village and 1^{er} Cru, but aged in old oak barrels.

We have been lucky enough to secure 10 cases of their Bourgogne Pinot Noir for the UK.

Maison Auvigue, Fuisse

Maison Auvigue is run by Sylvain Brenas, his greatgrandfather started as a merchant in 1946. The business expanded into winemaking later on with vineyards coming from Sylvain's mother's side.

The new winery was built in 2017 and is housed within an old church in the centre of Fuisse. They have around 9ha of vines in total and also purchase some fruit and juice for their wines, including their reds and Saint-Veran. They own vines in nine 1^{er} Cru vineyards, though only bottle four; the other small parcels are blended into a Pouilly-Fuisse 1^{er} Cru cuvee. Wines are fermented with natural yeasts in either stainless steel tanks, or 300l oak barrels, depending on the size of cuvee. As a general rule, more new oak is used on the 1er Cru sites.

The unoaked Macon-Fuisse presents a crisp, lean and mineral character. As you work up through the range the fruit becomes plush, rich and spicy with an acidy that balances the use of oak and will keep the wines fresh for ageing in the bottle.

Domaine des Marrans, Fleurie

Mathieu Mélinand has vineyards in Fleure, Morgon and Chiroubles and makes wines that are clean, precise and vibrant. His father started Domaine des Marrans in the 1970s with their Clos du Pavillon vineyard, slowly growing the domaine to 12ha. Now Mathieu and his brother Camille own 20ha of vines across these three villages.

A maximum amount of whole bunches are used where possible, fermenting with natural yeasts and avoiding the use of sulphur until the malolactic fermentation. The wines are racked once in spring and then settled for 6 months before bottling, unfined and unfiltered. Again, each cuvee has its own character, Les Marrans a little deeper and darker, the flagship monopole vineyard Clos du Pavillon has more structure and concentration, whereas Morgon Corcelette is savoury and full of energy. All will age incredibly well.

Richard Rottiers, Romanèche-Thorins, Moulin-à-Vent

Richard's family estate is Domaine des Malandes in Chablis, however marriage took him to Beaujolais. A three year stint at Chateau Thivin in Brouilly ignited his fascination with Gamay and its many expressions. In 2007 he set up Domaine Richard Rottiers in the village of Romanèche-Thorins and now owns several very old vineyards across the Moulin-a-Vent appellation which he tends organically. His wines can vary from crunchy and fresh, to structured and spicy, then a deeper coloured, smoky, bacon-fat scented cuvee - many styles of one varietal, in one village. Brilliant!

Julien Duport, Brouilly

Julien Duport has vineyards on both Mont Brouilly (Côte de Brouilly) and the opposite hillside of Mont Saburin (Bouilly). These are very steep vineyards, where the mixed geology makes for interesting winegrowing pink granite, schist, limestone and decomposing granite making up the coarse, sandy soils. Add century-old vines into the equation and you know the wines will be good before opening a bottle.

Again, natural yeast fermentations, minimal filtration and careful sulphuring only at the bottling stage helps retain maximum character. His wines are raised in barrel, tank and foudre. Expect dark fruits, amazing acidity, and structure for ageing.

Its serious stuff. Julien's Cote de Bouilly La Boucheratte is unlike anything you will have tried before and will make you see Beaujolais in a new light. Vines planted in 1900, 1925 and 1945, ploughed by horse. Aged in barrel for 24 months. It's somewhere between a top-end Burgundy, and Côte-Rôtie, a bit like the village of Brouilly itself.
